The Digital Learning Coordinator plays a vital role in our organization by facilitating and enhancing digital learning experiences for students in our afterschool programs. This role combines educational expertise with technical proficiency to create engaging, innovative, and effective digital learning initiatives. The coordinator will collaborate with educators, program directors, and external partners to ensure that our digital learning programs align with our organization's educational goals. Core responsibilities may include:
